#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTORAL ADMINISTRATOR ADAM HERMANSON



Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

During this past Sunday, on the 18<sup>th</sup>, Deacon Craig took the opportunity to incorporate his conversion story into his homily and I would imagine it encouraged a great deal of reflection for many of us. It got me thinking about my own conversion story to the fullness of the faith back in 2006, and how I just didn't get it myself. I thought I understood a lot of the fundamental teachings of the Church, but I was utterly

mistaken. First of all, I was very much what you would call a lukewarm and casual Christian. If it fit into my personal interpretation of who I believed God to be, I enjoyed practicing it, no matter how off course I was.

It was around 2007 that a friend of mine showed me what it looks like to be an authentic Catholic. In fact, he showed me what it looked like to live as an authentic Christian. This dear friend of mine modeled prayer and sacrifice in a way I thought was only found in the scriptures. It forced me to change how I viewed approaching Jesus, especially in the Eucharist!

During those years, I had also immersed myself in the college party life and came to realize this was an empty, dark path that would eventually lead my soul into destruction if I didn't change my lifestyle. I remember one day sitting by myself and whispering the "Hail Mary" prayer and asking Jesus to salvage whatever was left of me and to transform my life. The Holy Spirit began to minister to my soul and made Jesus more real to me than I could have ever imagined in the Eucharist. Celebrating mass and consuming Jesus' Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity became such an enjoyment, I now looking forward to celebrating this most Holy Sacrifice each week!

I look forward to working closely with those that are seeking Jesus and a relationship with him. If anyone wants to just talk about the possibility of conversion and God meeting you where you are at, but want to go deeper, my door is always open!


