

Dear Friends,

St. Cloud Diocese Parish Planning Update

In this Sunday's Gospel we hear Jesus speak to us in John chapter 6, "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever and the bread that I give is my flesh for the life of the world." (John 6:51) The real and true presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist is offered and given for us as the

spiritual food by which we truly live and strive for holiness and heaven which is at the heart of the mission of the Church. On Friday August 9th there was a meeting led by the St. Cloud Diocese Parish Planning Director, Brenda Kresky and Bishop Patrick Neary to discuss the next stage, "2.0" of the planning process. The St. Cloud Diocese began combining parishes to form "Area Catholic Communities" several years ago with Bishop Donald Kettler. The Area Catholic Communities were formed to help parishes work together in our current time of decline in Christianity in our culture which has left many parishes with declining faith and participation, a shortage of priests and almost no religious sisters. The St. Cloud Diocese currently has 131 parishes and 55 active priests.

The meeting on the 9th was a positive meeting with many facts and information given out. There was a time of discussion amongst the tables and time to ask questions, offer suggestions, thoughts and concerns. Much of the meeting was actually directed towards the mission of the church and how we can continue to grow and bring Christ to souls in our Church. In general and considering the circumstances, the meeting was very hopeful.

At this point the planning office and the bishop are still in the stage of gathering information and assessing, so there are no definite plans or answers to questions at this point. However, here are some updated points of information to note:

• The St. Cloud Diocese has hired a consulting firm called "Partner's Edge" to helped guide the 2.0 stage of the process.

• The meeting had a large focus on the mission of the Catholic Church to make disciples and the salvation of souls.

 \cdot Almost all of the parishes were built at a time of a large influx of immigrants from Germany, Poland and other countries who had small farms and hauled their large families to church each Sunday in a horse and buggy. This dynamic has changed dramatically.

 \cdot The planning committee will continue to take information and make assessment of the 29 ACC's in the diocese over the next several months. There is no current plan at this point.

• The planning committee is aiming to have a plan ready by July of 2025.

Please join me in prayer for our diocese and our Catholic Church in these next months as we continue to be on the mission for holiness and to bring Christ to others for the salvation of souls.




