

Jesus, the Servant Leader



Dear Friends.

As a younger man, the more serious I got about my faith and grew spiritually, the more I found myself involved in acts of service in the Church and the community. Where focus through much of my adolescent and school years had too often been my own accomplishments, after a conversion of faith in Christ, my

focus became more outward, and service orientated. The more I served, the more I desired to serve. Doing good for others brought joy and a new sense of fulfillment that personal accomplishments never did. A new sense of purpose and peace was born in my soul. Little did I know then, that God would call me to an even greater service of the Church in a vocation as a Catholic Priest.

In today's Gospel Jesus says, "For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many." (Mark 10:45) Jesus Christ gives us the model of how to lead others, which is by serving them. Jesus did not come to enslave his people by "Lording over" them, but he does quite the opposite, as he gives his entire life on earth in service of the people he has ultimate authority over. Christ gives the ultimate and final example of his servant-leadership as he lays down his life and dies on the cross for the people he came to save. He gave everything he had out of love. "Greater love has no one than to lay down his life for his friends." (John 15:13) As Christians, we are also called to be servant-leaders and lay down our lives for the people around us. We must do this with the strength that comes from Christ in the Holy Eucharist, the Sacrament of Christ's love.




