

A MESSAGE FROM DEACON LEO WEHSELER

All Glory and Praise to our God





Mass is the source and summit of our faith. It is the summation of all we believe contained in the sacrifice of the Mass. Because we are blessed to have Mass frequently, we can often take the Mass for granted. Everything in the Mass should be ordered and directed toward the worship of God. It's not about what we want, but about what is God asking of us. It is easy to miss everything that helps direct

us toward God in this worship. From dipping our fingers into the holy water fount and making the sign of the cross to remind us of our baptism, to the sending forth at the end of Mass to go in peace and spread the good news as disciples of Jesus; there is meaning in all we do. Bring someone to Mass who has never come before and see how many questions they ask! At times the combination of a full church combined with music, incense, bells, and chant moves us with emotion. While this is good, we must not become "emotion seekers" looking for that next thing to feed our emotions while at Mass. The movement of our soul is not always accompanied by movement in our emotions, and strong emotions don't always mean we have had a spiritual revelation. We are at Mass to worship God, to lay ourselves before him, and to let God direct what he wants from us, not to place our demands on God. One thing to point out is the diversity of our faith and the tension that keeps everything in balance. A great example of this is music and silence because the difference is most obvious. The General Instruction of the Roman Missal (GIRM) provides instruction on what is proper in the Mass. The GIRM is the big book that the priest uses at Mass and young servers try to hold up. Paragraph 41 reads "The main place should be given, all things being equal, to Gregorian chant, as being proper to the Roman Liturgy" encouraging all to sing as in paragraph 39 "Whoever sings well prays twice over" so please be sure to join in song! This is balanced by paragraph 45 in speaking of "Sacred Silence" which is to be observed at specific times of the Mass for specific reasons, such as for recollection of sins during the penitential rite, or after the homily to reflect on what we have heard. It is only when each part of the Mass is united together focusing all attention to God do all the pieces come together in perfect praise. Not music in competition with silence or vice versa but both complementing the other perfectly. I am looking forward to hearing everyone BOTH sing and be silent!


