

The True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist: The Sacrament of God's Love

Dear Friends,

Do you desire to be a Saint and bring peace to our broken world? If so great, the Church already has the plan for you. The greatest gift we have in our Catholic Faith is the Holy Eucharist, given to us at each Mass and always present in our Catholic Churches. The Last Supper the wonderous "Bread of Life" was instituted so that we can partake in Jesus' own life and become who we receive.

There is a story of a man who was trying to explain the Real Presence of Christ in the Tabernacle to a man of Muslim faith. The Muslim responded that if what he said was true, that God was really and truly present in that Church, the Church would be full of his Muslim people all day and all night and they would never want to leave.

As Catholics we have too often taken for granted the greatest gift God could give us. So, we must take action in order to increase our own love for Christ in the Holy Eucharist through visits to the Blessed Sacrament, daily Mass, preparing well for Mass and frequent confession.

St. John Paul II said, "United with the angels and saints of the heavenly Church, let us adore the most Holy Sacrament of the Eucharist. Prostrate, we adore this great mystery that contains God's new and definitive covenant with humankind in Christ." As we worthily, reverently and as frequently receive the Holy Eucharist, we become who we receive. St Paul of the Cross said, "Holy Communion is the most efficacious means of uniting oneself to God." And St. John Bosco said, "There are two things the devil is deadly afraid of: fervent Communions and frequent visits to the Blessed Sacrament."

As we grow in Christ-like virtues and the gifts of the Holy Spirit we are able to bring Christ's presence to others. "The Eucharist is the secret of my day. It gives me strength and meaning to all my activities of service to the Church and to the whole world," Said Pope Saint John Paul II.

And as we bring Christ to others we are participating, in part, in the life of Heaven. St Peter Julian said, "The Eucharist is the supreme proof of the love of Jesus. After this, there is nothing more but Heaven itself."

How do we become Saints and bring Heaven to earth? Make worthy, reverent and frequent receptions of Holy Communion and visits to the Blessed Sacrament. It is the wisdom of the Saints.


