**THE OFFERING OF INCENSE**

Dear Friends,

The tradition of using incense for worship runs deep in our Faith tradition. Incense was used in the Old Testament as the priest offered sacrifice for sins on behalf of the people. Incense is referenced several times in the scriptures. *“From the farthest east to the farthest west, my name is honored among the nations and everywhere a sacrifice of incense is offered to my name, and a pure offering too, since my name is honored among the nations.” (Malachi 1:11)*

In a culture that has in many ways lost a sense of Almighty God, our worship at the Holy Mass is meant to bring a sense of wonder, awe, love, and reverence due to our Father and Creator, who is mystery and hidden from our eyes. On the holy “Mountain of Transfiguration” the Father spoke to Peter, James and John from a cloud. *“Then from the cloud came a voice that said, ‘This is my chosen Son; listen to him.’” (Luke 9:35)* In faith we *“believe without seeing.”*

As we worship with a body and soul, we enter into the mystery of faith using our senses. We use our eyes, ears, touch, smell and even our taste. Not only does the mysterious smoke symbolize the prayers of the faithful drifting up to God, incense actually creates the ambiance of heaven. *“From the angel’s hand the smoke of the incense went up before God, and with it the prayers of God’s people” (Rev. 8:3-5)*. When we smell incense, we might be reminded of the holiness of God, the sweetness of God, the presence of God.

The Magi bring incense as an offering to Christ himself, and whenever Christ or the apostles go up to the Temple to pray, their prayers ascend to God along with the smoke of the incense. *“May my prayers rise up to you like incense.” (Psalm 141:2)*

The offering of incense is not only meant to aid us in worship, it is a sign of honor, reverence and respect to our Almighty God whom we owe our best offering each Sunday at Mass, and in everything that we have and are.

**Notes:**

\*We will begin to use incense on a regular schedule each month in our ACC. Considering that there are individuals with a sensitivity to incense, we will only use it on two of the Masses each weekend on the first two weekends of the month. The first weekend of the month, we will have incense at the 4pm and 8am Masses, and the second weekend we will have incense at the 6pm and 10am Masses. It will also be used on major Solemnities and Feast days such as; Holy Thursday, Easter, Christmas, Immaculate Conception, etc. Please keep in mind that the incense we will use is “allergy sensitive” incense, which has a lighter composure.

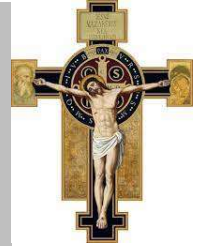

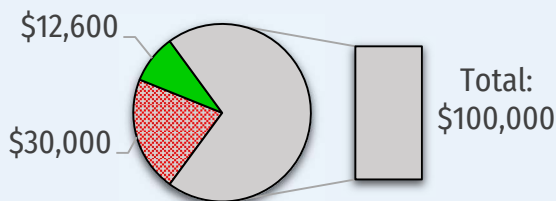
